New case of Dutch Elm Disease identified in Saskatoon!

The City of Saskatoon Parks Department has confirmed a new positive case of Dutch elm disease (DED) in an elm tree in the Varsity View neighbourhood and has initiated its DED Response Plan. DED is a serious disease caused by a fungus that clogs the elm tree's water and nutrient conducting system, which eventually causes the tree to die. In Saskatoon, elms make up 25% of our urban forest. It's time to talk to your neighbours and family members about not burning and storing elm wood. If they have it in their yards remove it and take it to the landfill free of charge. Don't delay, do it today, our Saskatoon tree survival depends on it.

One thing that has become painfully obvious is that watering trees can easily surpass the cost of planting trees. In Saskatoon the general rule is to water and weed for 3 three years. SOS Trees is tackling this challenge by recruiting individuals who assist with watering and maintenance of our tree plantings. This occurs weekly at our McPherson planting and bi weekly at our Sutherland planting.
