## Arbor Week was a success

A big thank you to our Arbor Week committee, our volunteers, partners, sponsors and everyone who made it a success. Arbor Week events have become a significant education and public awareness event in Saskatoon. We planted two beds of native trees and shrubs at Pierre Radisson Park, a park that must be one of the most barren parks in town. The SOS Trees Arbor Week school planting took a twist when at the last minute the 5th graders from Henry Kelsey School were restricted to remain inside the classroom due to smoke. The trees had been delivered, the water truck was there and our 11th graders from the outdoor school arrived via bike. So we went ahead and planted the majority of the trees. We saved 8 trees to plant the following week with the 5th grade students and both groups of students were quite excited about the opportunity. The planting was preceded with in class presentations by Yvan Lebel & Sharon Lynch. Film Night at Outer Limits was an evening about Canada's forests and the relationships that people have with them. Whether you participated in one of SOS Trees events, events hosted by partner organizations or you planted a tree in your yard or simply sat under and appreciated a tree we hope you had a memorable experience.

# Elms were looking bad

We were hearing from folks about the defoliated Elms. Cankerworm populations were up again this spring with pockets of severely defoliated elm (and to a lesser extent apple and maple) all over the city. Spring pest defoliation is not fatal, and the second flush of leaves has already started pushing out on some of the affected trees. We expect they should be back to full canopy within 3 weeks.

The best thing you can do for your trees is water your/city trees. A long deep watering will do miracles toward helping them bounce back. A good practice to get into in our semi arid environment.


### **Dutch Elm Disease Reminder**

Help protect our beautiful elm trees and historic canopies by:

- 1. Not storing or burning elm wood
- 2. Disposing of elm wood at the Saskatoon Landfill (it's free for residential loads!)
- 3. Never pruning elms during the April 1 August 31 ban
- 4.
